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## **From the Clubhouse**

# From the Desk of Jesse K. Thorpe, General Manager



Dear Members,

In response to the most frequently asked questions, below is a list of out current Covid-19 protocols. As always please contact me at the Club by phone (386) 445-0747 or by email at jthorpe@hammockdunesclub.com for any additional clarification you might need.

- Quarantine: We are still asking that members who have traveled to Hammock Dunes by mass transit or who have guests who come by mass transit to observe a seven-day quarantine from Clubhouse amenities. All outdoor sports and activities, to-go dining and wine purchases are available for enjoyment.
- Masks: We continue to require use of a mask when inside the Clubhouses, except when seated with a beverage or for meal service. The mask must cover nose and mouth.
- Vaccines: I am trying to arrange the availability of vaccines at our site, if possible. The vaccination process is under the aegis of the Flagler County Health Department. We are not keeping a signup list for appointments. All details will be established by Health Department Officials and will be forwarded when available. As indicated by officials, the greatest limitation we face is the availability of sufficient doses of vaccines for the demand in Flagler County.
- Already vaccinated?- For those fortunate to have already received both doses of vaccine, all protocols remain the same, except the seven-day quarantine requirement, provided the individuals continue to observe all other protocols. As noted:
  - » The vaccine does not mean 100% protection from the virus.
  - » The virus is mutating, and vaccines may have reduced effectiveness.
  - » Being vaccinated does not prevent a person from being an asymptomatic carrier and being able to infect others.
  - » The length of vaccine immunity is unknown.
  - » The CDC recommends continuation of mask wearing and social distancing until herd immunity levels of vaccination achieved.

I wish to thank the many members who are so diligent in observing these protocols for the health and safety of fellow members, their guests and our staff. By now, carrying a mask has become part of our culture. We appreciate your support as we continue to work through this challenge.

## Tips and Techniques from Pastry Chef Jim Guzzaldo

Baking Technique #7 - Sponge Cake (With Irish Coffee Tira Misu Recipe)

Mixing and baking sponge cake is a baking technique that builds off the technique I discussed in January, whipping eggs. Sponge cakes are leavened by whipped egg foams, and produce a light, springy cake used in a



wide variety of fine, European style cakes and pastries. Additional ingredients, as well as various means of whipping and incorporating eggs create a wide array of cakes, from ladyfingers to pound cake. I will offer a brief explanation of the universal principals consistent throughout the various approaches to sponges, and then outline some of the more common varieties. Follow the link to access my recipe for Irish Coffee Tira Misu, complete with home made Ladyfingers. Don't feel like making it yourself? Let me make it for you! I will be featuring this dessert throughout the month of March on my dessert menu, available from the Links clubhouse.

#### Recipe for Ladyfinger Sponge

Ingredients

Granulated Sugar

Eggs, Separated

Milk

Vanilla Extract

All Purpose Flour

Baking Powder

1 ½ Cups

1 ½ tsp

1 ½ Cups

2 ½ tsp

#### Procedure:

- Preheat oven to 325 degrees and prepare one half sheet pan (18" X 13") by lining it with parchment paper.
- Combine milk and vanilla, set aside.
- Sift flour and baking powder, set aside.
- In mixer with whip attachment, beat egg yolks with ¾ cup of the sugar until pale in color, and doubled in volume.
- Transfer yolk mixture to large mixing bowl and wash the mixer bowl and whip.
- Whip egg whites in clean mixer bowl until frothy, then add remaining sugar, whip on high until glossy.
- While egg whites are whipping, gently stir flour mixture into egg yolk mixture, alternating with milk mixture, and beginning and ending with flour (three additions of flour, two of milk) to make a batter.
- Once egg whites are stiff and glossy, gently fold into the batter until just combined, but without streaks.
- Transfer batter to pan, spread even, and bake for 15-20 minutes, until lightly golden and springs back at a gentle
- Remove from oven, cool completely before using.

### Audubon Corner...

Thanks to Ann Tranzow and Nancy Cumming for these great pictures of a Great Horned Owl.





Their name is derived from the feathers that appear to be "horns" near their ears. They are 18-25" in length with a wingspan of 36-60" and weigh 32-63.5oz. The female is 10-20% larger than the male. They are very long-lived some living up to 19 years in the wild.

Owls have spectacular binocular vision, [can see in low light]. Their eyes are almost as big as ours but are immobile. In order to see they can turn their head a full 270 degrees. Usually, they hunt at night so their vision as well as their amazing hearing is very important. Their ears are not placed in the same position of either side of their head. The right ear is typically set higher and at a slightly different angle. An owl can pinpoint both the horizontal and vertical direction of a sound, giving them wonderful depth perception and up and down direction. They hunt mostly small mammals but 250 different diet items have been found. These birds have 200-300 lbs per square inch of crushing power in their talons and can easily take prey 2 to 3 times their weight so watch over your small dogs and cats.


