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FROM THE KITCHEN

What a way to start off the new year with a lot of culinary excitement. It has been a busy month, I must say.

The weekend of January 12, I competed in the Semifinals for the National Title of ACF (American Culinary Federation) Chef of the Year. It was a great experience meeting and competing against some of the top chefs in the country at the Culinary Institute at Virginia Western in Roanoke, VA. The two ingredients that we were required to use were Bone In Lamb Saddle and Slab Bacon. It was a Category KC Hot Food Competition where we had



1 hour to cook and prepare 4 entrees with a 10 minute plating window. The clock ran down to the last second as I placed my last finishing ingredient onto the last of 4 plates. Perfect timing. I came away with a Gold Medal in the award ceremony, but missed 1st place by 1 point. It was great to have the exposure from it being streamed online across the nation and hearing from Chefs in the industry from Florida to Massachusetts, saying it was great to watch. If selected for 2020 semifinals, I am determined to move on to Nationals.




It was a great showing for Hammock Dunes Club on Monday, January 14 at St. Johns Technical High School Culinary Academy. I (along with our Lead Line Cook Ryan Schmidt) entered into a competition that was being held with 6 area Chefs competing in a mystery basket format with the same timeline as the Virginia competition (4 entrees with 1 hour and 10 minutes to plate). The event was sponsored by the ACF St. Augustine Chapter and had more than 60 spectators (the event raised money for/and promoted the chapter as well as the Culinary Program at the school). The attraction (for me) to the event is that the culinary students were the judges. They had the opportunity to observe, ask questions and learn so much from this experience – as they too will be competing towards the end of the school year in Regionals and attempt to advance to the State Competition level. The students presented me with the highest marks and awarded me the overall top prize. I was honored.

Thrilled to have received my WCEC (Worldchefs Certified Executive Chef) which is an International Certification through WACS (World Association of Chefs Societies). I will be going for my WCMC (Worldchefs Certified Master Chef) in the upcoming months. As of December 2018 there are only 22 in the world that hold this distinguished WCMC certification.

It is always great to get the Hammock Dunes Club Culinary Team involved with events, competitions, certifications, etc. Events like these improves on a culinarian's skills tenfold, increases efficiency and organization of one's work station/flow and adds finesse to their plating technique. Most of all it keeps them excited, involved and always pushes them to be better than the day before.



Pros Corner... Tips for a Powerful Tennis Backhand

These tennis backhand tips will give you some ideas on how to hit a powerful backhand. The best technique to hit a backhand is to hold your racket in such a way that the face of your racket is not open during the point of contact with the ball. To accomplish this, you have to hold the racket in such a way that your palm is holding the top part of the racket handle. Then support the racket with your left hand (for right handed players) by holding the throat of the racket.

Tennis backhand tip 1

The first tennis backhand tip is simple. Make sure your backhand shot gets an adequate warm-up and rather than trying to run around every backhand attempt to hit your backhand crosscourt. Getting into the habit of hitting too many inside-out forehands can exemplify the weakness on your backhand wing over time due to a lack of practice.

Racket Preparation for the backhand Preparation is crucial for the tennis backhand, whether it's the one handed or two handed tennis backhand, the principles are very much the same. Good preparation means recognizing the ball early, and getting a head start on the tennis ball's flight path. This means that your eyes must recognize your opponents hit sooner so your body knows where to move. Understand that preparation is the first step that starts the tennis backhand, and lack of preparation will be detrimental to getting to the tennis ball on time and ready to execute the shot.

The preparation on the tennis backhand is very much the same on both the one handed and two handed tennis backhand. In both cases, the eyes recognizes the opponent's point of contact, and as soon as that happens, you must initiate the preparation with the body first. Taking a wild backswing immediately after the opponent's hit will not only cause you to mistimed the ball, but also you will not get the clean contact that you want on the tennis backhand.


