





Pros Corner... The Drop Shot

The drop shot is probably the least most practiced shot in all of tennis even at the pro level. It is fun to do with a friend and one of the ways to have a good target and hit with lots of slice and control is to have a friend sit in a chair about three feet from the net just inside the inner sideline and you try to hit drop shots into the lap of your friend on the other side of the net, so they can catch them easily.

To execute a good drop shot you need a continental grip which is the grip making the V right down the middle which you use for slice and overheads. If you are not an experienced player choke up on the grip about one inch from the bottom, so you have great control of the racquet head and the face of the racquet.

The head of the racquet should be raised up above the wrist and the face slightly open and laid back to produce slice. Take a short backswing with an upward movement of the arm and racquet with a very firm wrist and come down the back underside of the ball using a sideways "J" means you start above the ball and then curve the racquet face slightly underneath the back side of the ball to impart the backspin so that ball stays low and does not go very deep.

The speed of your swing will depend a little on the speed of the ball coming at you but the best way to first practice is to drop the ball on the ground and bounce it slightly above the waist and a little in front of you so that you move forwards to the ball and try to make contact slightly above the net or at net level.

A good drop shot will bounce at least three times before the ball goes past the service line. If your friend in the chair cannot easily catch the ball and is ducking to get out of the way, you need more practice.



Audubon Corner.

Cedar Waxwings, one of our winter visitors, are only 71/2" long, they have a bandit like black mask and waxy red appendages on the tips of their wings at maturity.



Males and females look alike. These birds are groupies, loving to move in flocks. Migration and

their movements are nomadic and unpredictable in pattern wandering to find food. They LOVE berries [85% of what they eat] and cones of the Cedar tree when available and insects when they are not. They feed in flocks but are different than other flock birds. Instead of everyone for himself, they share.



They settle in the top branches of a tall tree. The flock, then taking turns, rotates in and out of the food source in groups of five to ten birds. They bathe in the same rotating manner and groom each other. Mating is late in the season to take advantage of the abundance of fruit in the Fall to feed their chicks.
