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### **From the Clubhouse**

## From the Desk of Jesse K. Thorpe, General Manager



Dear Members,

Well the weather has made golf an endurance sport this summer- very warm and very wet! The only redemption in all this weather is that the Bermuda Grass has thrived- because what we find uncomfortable, provides optimal conditions for growth. I have had many members comment on the wonderful conditions on the courses and on the croquet courts. Of course, a good growing season provides a better base for the next cooler season (whenever that might happen).

I thought it would be interesting to share another example of Club involvement in our community. As you might or might not be aware, the Club has partnered with "Habitat for Humanity" in Flagler County using Community Contribution Tax Credits (CCTCP). In essence, under a state approved program, we can direct a portion of our state sales tax collected to Habitat for the construction of homes. We have been doing this for more than 8 years. Working with Habitat we complete an application and receive tax credits, and we fund the construction. In Flagler County, Habitat has just completed its 111th home, with 20 of those funded by credits through Hammock Dunes Club (and three of these have been for Hammock Dunes related staff). In fact, we have applied for credits to build two more homes, and are presently waiting for approval from the state. If you aren't familiar with how Habitat works, I encourage you to check out information on their website, or even talk with Club Members Jack Leckie and Willy Jones who serve on Habitat's Board in Flagler County.

As we get deeper into the summer, we can hope for two things: 1) a break in the weather and 2) no hurricanes in our area. Meanwhile we will be here and getting things ready for the next season!

#### FROM THE KITCHEN

When it comes to eating healthy, the best food for the cause is quinoa. Quinoa is a grain crop primarily grown for its edible seeds. It is closely related to spinach and beetroots. It is indigenous to Peru, Ecuador, Colombia, and Bolivia but now has a varietal produced in the Northern Hemisphere.



During cultivation the outer, bitter tasting saponins have a beneficial effect, as it is unpopular with birds. After harvest the seeds must be processed to remove the unpalatable saponins. The seeds are in general cooked the same way as rice (or short grain Arborio rice - risotto style) and can be used in a wide range of dishes. Quinoa is considered a super food due to its high protein content and the fact that it contains all 9 essential amino acids. Quinoa is a great source of fiber, is gluten free and is easily digested. At the Club, we use the varietals of: white, red, and black quinoa in our blended rice and vegetarian dishes.



Quinoa can be used as a base for many salads as well. Cooking quinoa is easy, 1 part quinoa to 2 parts liquid (by volume). Bring both to a boil, turn down to a simmer, cover and cook for 15 to 20 minutes (until the liquid is absorbed and quinoa is tender). Spread into a mixing bowl or casserole dish to cool. Once cooled, combine

with ingredients to your liking: "avocado-red onion-cherry tomato with a balsamic-dijon dressing" or a "black bean-cilantro-chili pepper-lime vinaigrette" combination are just a couple examples...

Teeing off over an hour before the final group, Sean Dale started the day eight shots behind the leader. He went out and fired a 9-under 63 in the final round to head to the clubhouse with a two-shot lead over the field.

### On the Courts

#### Pros Corner...

The Open Stance Forhand

If you watch top level tennis these days – juniors, college or pro – you will rarely see players using the classic, old-school footwork when hitting their forehands (turn sideways and step toward the ball with the left foot [right handers]). The overwhelming majority of forehands hit are "open stance, where the shoulders and hips are turned sideways, but the right footsteps sideways into the shot, not the left foot.

When hitting open stance, the shoulders and hips rotate and "open up" to face forward. Players will use the open stance when the ball is hit wide to their forehand, making them run; on high balls; on deep balls; or a combination of these 3 things. There just isn't time to take a step with the left foot towards the ball – inevitably, the left footsteps sideways and the body gets in the way preventing hitting the ball in front of the body. Contact will always be cramped and behind the body.

Hitting open stance gets the body out of the way and allows a player to contact in front – and with the hips rotating while hitting, there can be tremendous power in the shot. Players will only step forward into the shot with the left foot if the ball coming to them is shorter, lower and right to them – something that doesn't happen a whole lot in tennis.

Try the open stance forehand yourself – then you can hit Djokovic type winner forehands from anywhere on the court!! on be celebrating a lot more success on the court!

Judon Internation A few Sundays ago while exiting the club in the garden plot next to the Golf shop I found a baby gopher tortoise. How it got there is a mystery. Their burrows can be 50 feet long and they share.

They are classified as Vulnerable. The main threat to them is loss of habitat due to development and being poached for the pet trade.

You will be happy to know that I relocated our little tortoise to Clicker Beach where he should have a happy life.
