From the Clubhouse

Updated Covid Precautions at the Club

Many of you are returning to the Sunshine State from your homes in other areas. WELCOME BACK and we look forward to seeing everyone enjoying the Club. Unfortunately, the Covid pandemic has not left us. We ask all Members to continue to observe the protocols that are currently in place including properly wearing a mask while in the Clubhouse and Fitness Center. We will continue to monitor the situation and relax restrictions as conditions improve. We do not want to be on the forefront of a possible second wave.

Golf Course

With everyone returning and golf rounds being higher than ever, we cannot continue our current policy of single rider carts without reducing the number of tee times available. We ask for your support while implementing the following policies:

- Couples and those living in the same household, and members bringing guests are required to ride two per cart.
- We ask all willing members to ride two per cart when possible.
- We recognize that some of our members may have legitimate medical reasons for not riding in a cart with others and respect their right to do so. Therefore, we encourage these members to continue to request to ride alone.
- We continue to encourage walkers and pull cart users and will continue to charge \$11 for walking at any time.
- Effective November 2, rakes will be restored to bunkers on the courses and ball washers uncovered for use.

Dining

• Effective Sunday November 1 Chef Cook and his team will offer a weekly Breakfast Buffet. The buffet will have employee attendants serving food items to the members to limit common touch points. No items will be self-serve. Selections, other than the build-your-own-omelet station and some of the basics, will vary from week-to-week.



- Effective Monday, November 2 the Creek Dining Room will re-open for dinner service on Mondays. Dining seating will be by advance reservation only, as seating will be restricted to 70% of capacity
- In conjunction with the Creek opening for dinner, Links takeout service on Mondays will cease on November 2.
- Effective November 3, Chef Cook will resume two distinctive menus at the Links. One menu will be for the Tavern only, and the other will serve members in the Seaside and Oceanview Ballroom seating.
- The Dress Code for the Seaside Dining Room and Oceanview Ballroom will be reinstated.
- Effective November 1, there is a NEW Grocery Order Form, and a revised grocery pickup schedule. All orders for Grocery Service must be submitted by Sunday of each week for pickup on Wednesdays (only) between 2 p.m. 5 p.m. Notifications will be sent via email when orders are received, and packages will be available for pickup at the front door of the Links Clubhouse.
- Thanksgiving service will be 100% takeout service only. A special take out menu with a wide selection of Thanksgiving favorites is available for parties of all sizes. (see the takeout order form in this Dunescape issue on page 6).

From the Kitchen...

I wanted to touch on some of the survey points that came back earlier in the year and inform everyone on some of the new changes being implemented.

MENU VARIETY

- Now that restrictions have been lifted, we are able to releax some of the confinements that we've been under during the last six months of this year. By design we have been operating intentionally with limited offerings that changed daily for take-out during the early portion of this pandemic to transitioning to one menu (Tavern) that served multiple rooms. That all changes in November: **Seaside will have its own menu** once again that is offered Tuesday through Sunday, giving us the opportunity to expand our offerings.
- As well as: the Creek will be opening back up on Mondays for dinner service with new menus for both lunch and dinner.



MENU CHANGE FREQUENCY

- A common theme among the survey results was "menu change frequency". Even though over 50% of the menu changed four times per year. I didn't feel it was enough for the member who dines at the club multiple times per week. After touching base with some of my colleagues in the industry on what they are doing at their clubs, this is the result: All menus will change every 60 days! On that timeline the next menu change for the Tavern is December 1. Creek and Seaside menus will change again January 1. If you have some past favorites or new concepts you would like to see on a menu, just send me an email at the address listed below and I will try my best to incorporate when feasible. The features will still be emailed daily with 4 to 5 new items every 1 to 2 days (as has been in the past).
- The dessert menus will change every 30 days.

HAPPENINGS

- November 1 Sunday Brunch (Breakfast) will transition to a "buffet" format located in the Oceanview Ballroom. We encourage members to make reservations throughout the clubhouse and enjoy the buffet offered from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. The staple items (omelet station, bacon, sausage links, hashbrowns) will remain the same each Sunday with other rotational offerings (waffles, pancakes, French toast, biscuits and gravy, grits, etc...). See the advertisement in this newsletter. The service and kitchen staff will be assisting members with their plates as they proceed through the line asking what they would like. Staff will adhere to the safety precautions in place (i.e. masks, gloves, hair restraints, etc...). Once the plate is complete at the end, it will then be transitioned to the member. This is to eliminate any shared touch points between individuals, keeping safety of the utmost importance.
- Effective November 1, there is a NEW Grocery Order Form, and a revised grocery pickup schedule. All orders for Grocery Service must be submitted by Sunday of each week for pickup on Wednesdays (only) between 2 p.m. 5 p.m. Notifications will be sent via email when orders are received, and packages will be available for pickup at the front door of the Links Clubhouse.
- The "Cook at Home with Chef Cook" meal kits continue to be a success. If you haven't had the opportunity to try one yet, watch your email for the next dish. New concept every Tuesday with the YouTube QR Link and written instructions. Feel free to subscribe to my YouTube channel to get sneak peaks. (Handle: Chef Lance Cook). We will offer the new dish as a feature (in the Tavern and Seaside) a day or two each week as a featured item. Watch your daily food and beverage emails.
- "If you don't see it, ask"... We understand sometimes there is just that one dish that you are craving; or perhaps you have guests in town that you would like to offer something different, etc... We are not limited by what is listed on the menu. Our inventory level consists of a couple thousand products. If it is something that can be easily swapped out (switching from bun to lettuce wrap, etc) inquire with your server at the time of dining. If it is something not on the menu that requires a little more time to prepare (past menu items, chicken parmesan, dishes with specific dietary restrictions, etc...), please inform us 24 hours ahead of time so we can make your dining experience fluent and enjoyable. The best way is to email me at: lcook@hammockdunesclub.com and we will take care of it to the best of our abilities. * If it is something ordered at the time of dining that we have the product for / the time for (with other orders streaming in) and we are able to accommodate such request, please understand there may be a time delay as we prepare that item from scratch.



Tips and Techniques from Pastry Chef Jim Guzzaldo

Baking Technique #3- Baked Custards

Custards are liquids that are set, or thickened, primarily with the addition of eggs. They can range from custard sauce (crème anglaise) to bread pudding and include such familiar fare as quiche and cheesecake. Custards fall into two broad categories- stirred and baked. I will be focusing on baked custards here but will just touch on the difference. Stirred custards include crème anglaise, pastry crème, and blancmange. As their name implies, they are made on the stove top, stirring while they cook. Baked custards, on the other hand, are cooked in the oven, and baked until set. Baked custards include the classic crème brulee, flan, cheesecake, bread pudding, quiche, and strata.

The Method

Most baked custards are made in the following manner: scald (bring to a boil) the liquid dairy, be it milk, cream, or a combination, usually with sugar and any flavorings such as vanilla bean. Once the dairy is at a boil, slowly pour it into the eggs, whisking continuously, and immediately chill. Custards are best left to rest before baking.

When baking custards, a lower temperature is required, usually 275-325 degrees. Many custards are baked in a water bath, setting the baking dish in one half inch of water. Custards have a relatively long bake time because of their lower baking temperature and are done when they jiggle like jello when they are shaken, rather than making waves as they do when underbaked.

The Reason

Stirred and baked custards are cooked to 185 degrees. At this temperature, the proteins in the eggs will set the liquid custard. Exceeding this temperature will curdle the custard, resulting in an undesirable texture, and separation of the water from proteins in the custard. This is why a lower baking temperature is used, and a water bath will further insulate from overcooking. The exception to this is if a starch is included in the custard base, such as with pastry cream. 8039

The Recipe Pumpkin Pie

Ingradianta

Ingredients:	
Canned Pumpkin	13 oz
Flour	2 T
Cinnamon	1 tsp
Nutmeg	1/4 tsp
Ginger	1/4 tsp
Cloves	1/8 tsp
Salt	1/4 tsp
Brown Sugar	¹⁄₂ Cup + 2T
Eggs	2
Light Corn Syrup	2 T
Milk	12 oz
Pie Shell	1





Procedure:

- In a mixer fitted with a whip attachment, mix pumpkin, flour, spices, salt, and sugar.
- Mix to combine.
- Add eggs, mix, scrape down sides and bottom of bowl, mix again briefly.
- With mixer running, slowly pour in corn syrup, then milk.
- Let mixture rest for 30 minutes. Preheat oven to 400 degrees while mixture rests.
- Fill pie shell with custard, bake for 10 minutes on bottom shelf of oven, then turn the oven down to 350 degrees, bake for another 30-40 minutes, until pie jiggles.
- Once done, turn off oven, and let pie slowly cool with oven door propped open, if safe and possible. If not, remove pie from oven and put in a warm place to cool slowly. This will help prevent cracking.

*** Pumpkin pie is baked differently than most custards. A high initial bake temp helps the crust to set, and the starch from the pumpkin, as well as the additional flour, help to avoid curdling. Care still needs to be taken not to overbake the pie, to avoid it cracking and splitting. The marred appearance won't affect the flavor, though, and can just be covered with extra whipped cream if necessary.


